What is the purpose of this step?

You cannot overcome character flaws without humility. Too often, alcoholics are victims of pride and selfishness. During this step, you begin to practice modesty and welcome a change of attitude, which will lead to a happy life.

It is important to feel the pain you masked with alcohol

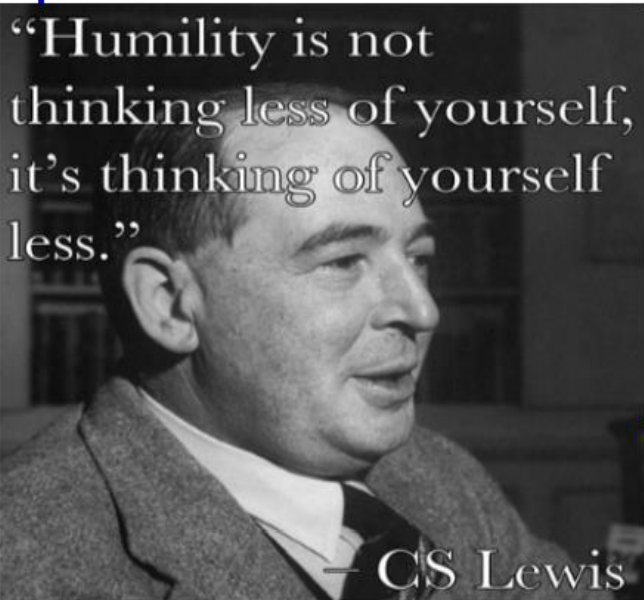
Give up self-reliance for reliance on a higher-power. Learn to practice humility and put character-building ahead of comfort. Make "honesty, tolerance, and true love of man and God the daily basis of living". Accept that humility is necessary to achieve a sober and fulfilled life. Change your perspective from a self-centered one to a humble, selfless one.

What are some Myths about step 7
